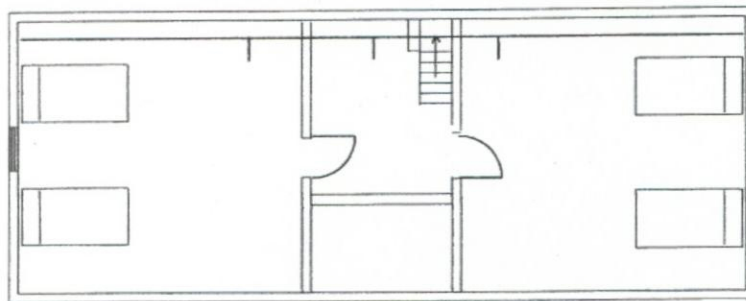
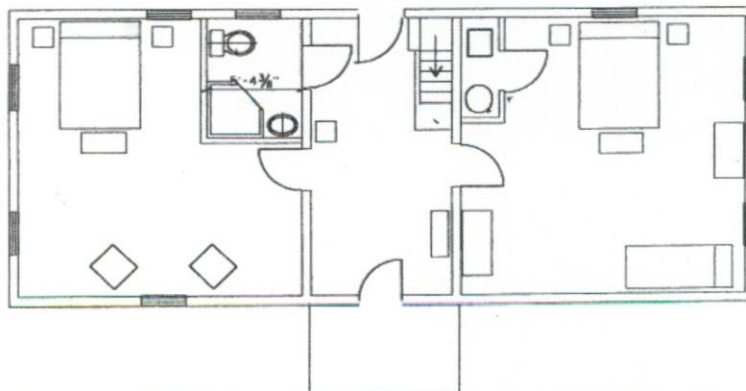


GUEST HOUSE

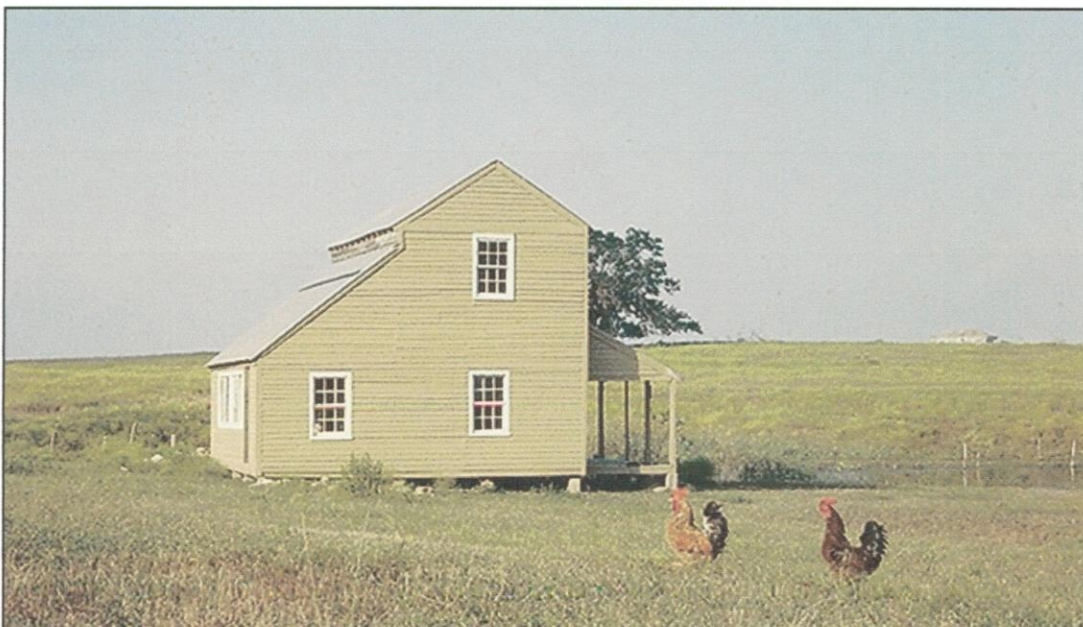


SECOND FLOOR



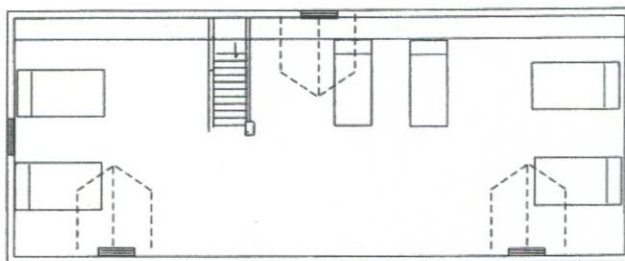
\$100 HOUSE

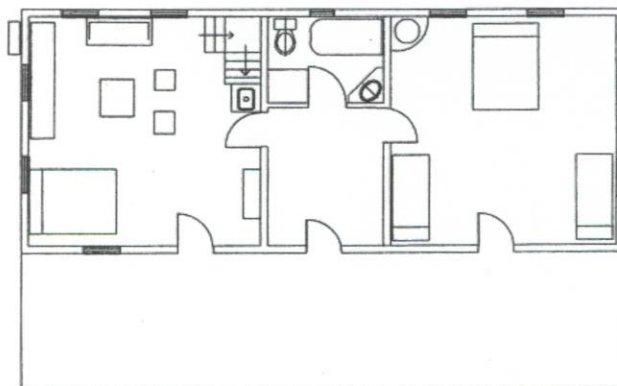


\$500 HOUSE

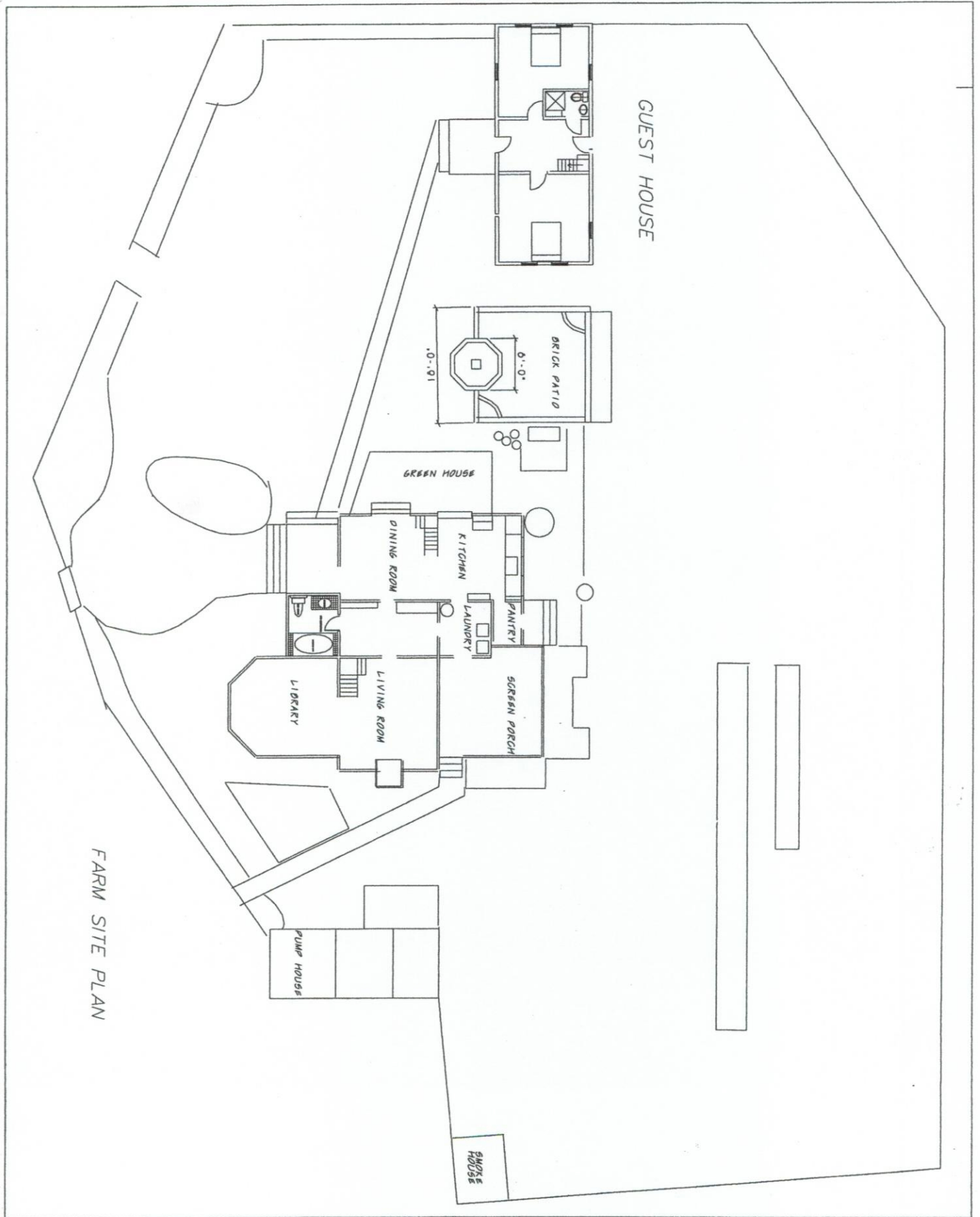
